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Welcome Back!

I'm so honored your book club has chosen to continue the *Believers of the Last Hour* journey with *Those Who Wait Upon the Lord*.

This part of the story invites us to wrestle with what it really means to trust God's timing — especially when answers feel far away and hope feels stretched thin. As you read, I pray it encourages honest conversation, deeper faith, and a renewed sense of what it means to endure together.

Before you dive into the questions, take a moment to pray together and invite the Holy Spirit to lead your discussion.

Discussion Questions

The Struggle of Waiting

- Waiting can feel like doing nothing — yet Scripture often calls us to “*wait upon the Lord*.” How does this book portray the challenge of waiting on God?
- Can you relate to a time in your life when waiting felt just as difficult as taking action?
- Is there an area in your life right now where you're being called to wait?

Strength Renewed

- Isaiah 40:31 (NKJV) promises that *those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength*. In what ways do the characters experience renewal even in captivity?
- How have you experienced God's strength in seasons of waiting?

False Peace vs. True Peace

- New Babylon offers comfort — but at a price. How does the book show the difference between false peace and real peace?
- In what ways are the characters tempted to compromise their beliefs — and how do they respond?
- Where do we see similar temptations today?

Suffering and Refinement

- Suffering isn't wasted in the story — it shapes the characters. How does God use suffering to refine and prepare His people?
- Which characters changed the most through hardship?
- Has God ever used a painful season to grow something in you?

Personal Reflection

- Obedience is a central theme in Book 2. Has God ever asked you to obey when it didn't seem to make sense?
- If you were placed in the same situation as the Believers — underground, hunted, and waiting on God — how do you think your faith would hold up?
- What might you do differently after reading this story?
